Comments

Helicobacter pylori is a gram negative bacteria responsible for about 80-90% cases of gastritis and suspected to be a major co-factor for the development of gastric and duodenal ulcers. The colonization of gastric and duodenal mucous membranes with Helicobacter pylori can be detected serologically by enzyme immunoassay tests. Detection of IgA antibodies indicates acute infection even if no bacteria are detected on mucous membrane biopsy, indirect immunofluorescence or urease test.
